We've noticed an increase in undesired student behavior this school year, including class disruption, disrespect and defiance. Our 6th grade classroom has been piloting a behavior management program titled "CHAMPS" this year and it is highly effective. We will be implementing this CHAMPS program school-wide effective immediately. There will be more information coming from your students' teacher this week. Essentially the program consists of setting clear expectations for behavior and following up with a structured warning system starting with a whole group reminder, several individual reminders for a student and then parent contact. It follows our default behavior management system but is more structured and when used with fidelity works exceptionally well.

New Visitor Procedures

Every school year we have to adjust procedures and protocols based on new legislation and recommendations from the Sheriff's Office. We were already using the check-in kiosk by the front office, based on these recommendations to keep track of students and visitors. Based on new recommendations from the Sheriff's office, this kiosk will now move from the front office area to the vestibule as you enter the school. This procedure will be consistent across all the schools in our valley. We understand this is not the most convenient procedure, but these recommendations are based on research and are designed to keep our students and staff as safe as possible.

When you come to visit the school, you will scan your license at the kiosk in the front vestibule. The kiosk will print out a slip with your photo and name on it. When someone's license is scanned it runs their information through a database to ensure that the individual does not have any red flags that would not allow them on a school campus. You would then push the ringer on the camera by the door. The office will ask you to hold up your printout for them to verify.
